Julia and Karen made their annual visit to Nepal in April and once again, stayed at the orphanage. Their visit was self funded.

The children are all happy and thriving. It was interesting, with the addition of the new children how the dynamics of the family group has changed. The children who seemed so young last year have taken on a new maturity and play a huge roll in mentoring and guiding the younger children.

The children continue to gain confidence when speaking English, even the very tiny ones practiced their counting and alphabet whilst we were there.



During our visit we were fortunate enough for Dr Hazel Polge (the grand-daughter of one of Julia's patients) to visit the orphanage. She gave all the children and staff a thorough medical examination and highlighted areas of concern, which have now been addressed.

As is becoming an annual event, we took the children and Dr Hazel for a picnic in the Botanical Gardens. As always we were quite a spectacle dancing around our rented hi-fi system. As always Anjana made everyone a delicious picnic lunch.

One funny incident we had whilst there was when we had a 'Question and Answer session', this was to encourage the children to use their English skills. Suntali asked us why we are so white and clean!

Children

 The children remain happy and healthy and are all attending school full time. Unfortunately whilst we were there, Ram was admitted to hospital with severe vomiting and stayed there for 3 days. This illustrated to us how difficult life becomes for the family in this situation as a family member has to stay with the patient and provide all food and personal care.



It was also quite a shock for us to see the conditions of a 'private' hospital in Nepal. The lack of equipment and hygiene standards were shocking and highlighted the importance of good hygiene.

- We continue to protect the children against Typhoid, Diphtheria, Tetanus and Hepatitis B. Chandra also had a Pneumonia vaccination as he has a weak chest.
- Niranjan passed his +2 (sixth form) with placing in the top 5 of 105 students in his school. Through a contact of Jan's, Niranjan was given an interview with the Standard Chartered Bank in Kathmandu. In preparation for this, Julia, Karen and Anjana accompanied him to the tailors to have a new suit and shirt made.





We were delighted that Niranjan secured a 6 month contract within the Bank which will give him valuable skills and confidence.

- Sujata did very well in her SLC exams and has earned a place studying science. We are very proud of Sujata to be our first girl to attend college.
- Niranjan and Pawan. For the past year the two oldest boys have been preparing to live independently. Bharat and Anjana have been training them to cook, clean and do their own laundry as well as learning how to budget their money.



This month they have moved out of the orphanage and moved into a room which they share together with kitchen and bathroom facilities. Their room is near to the orphanage so they still have the support from Bharat and Anjana.

We will temporarily subsidise their living expenses until they can support themselves fully.

One of our original orphans who worked for us for a year has now moved on and found employment abroad. We wish him every success in the future.

Animals



The ultimate goal for the orphanage is to become self sufficient. Bharat managed to secure a piece of land rent free for 5 years. This accommodates the animals and enables him to grow vegetables which they consume. Any excess is taken to market and sold.

Cow – with profits made from selling some piglets, we have purchased a pregnant Jersey cow. It should produce enough milk to give the children and make money from selling the excess.

Goats – we have sold some of the goats to buy more breeding pigs, but have retained 2 female goats, 1 kid and a billy goat.

Pigs – we now have 7 female pigs, 3 of which are pregnant and 1 boar.

I feel our room silent and we remember to our big family cps and you. i am searching job after completing my grade 12. we some times goes to cps to meet brothers, sisters, uncle and aunt. Niranjan helps me to read and he teach me about the exam Questions. I am also interested about joining job after my plus two and i have to make money for my daily life. I hope I will also become independent like Niranjan. Madam, I have missing you . please let me stop to close my writing . Thank you. Your obedient child, Pawan. Grade 12

Dear madam Namaste . I am Basanta and I am very happy to write you email. We all the children are fine and reading well. How are you? We are thinking you are fine in Uk. It is very cold in Kathmandu and I think it is also cold there. I am coming to cyber to write the feelings of Suntali, Sangita, Rekha. they said with me in Nepali and trying to write in English.

We are very happy to live in cps home. we eat dal, rice, vegetable and we drink milk. we were not getting to eat before coming to cps. We used to feel hungry all the time and wanted to eat more food before coming to cps,now we eat daily and feel our stomach. We did not think that we could get chance to live in a home like cps. we used to see children going to school in the village now we are also going to school. we have friends in school and uncle, aunt many brothers and sisters at cps home and we are getting love and food, education. we feel happy to go school, we go altogether with our brothers and sisters. We drink tea and biscuit in the morning and we read and write. we eat Rice, dal, vegetable and drink half glass of milk and we go to school. At school we eat some times prawan, some time, bread, some days, biscuit and some days apple. we eat at 1 noon at school when we go back home from the school we eat tea, bread some days, biscuits, some days, noodles. we eat meat also. some days we eat Rice, fish, vegetable, dal. some days, meat, Rice, vegetables, dal. I like milk very much. we are sleeping in warm beds.
