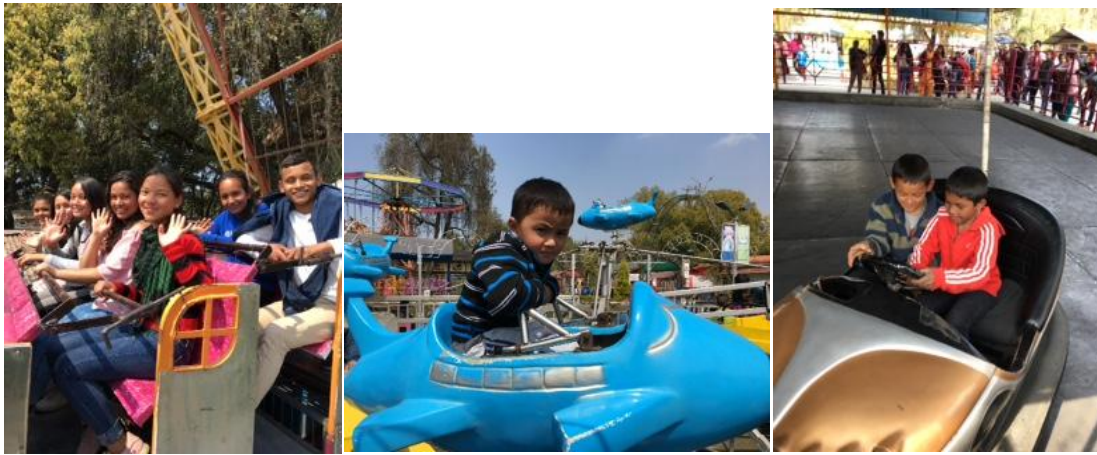
Jan is just back from another fantastic visit to CPS and is very happy to report that all the CPS family are on top form. Her visit was self-funded as always.
